Rookery Substantial Completion

The Rookery Area is an island East of Dike C where Blue Herons nest. On December 22, 2008, a majority of the island was covered with ash from the Kingston Ash Spill. The ash was anything between almost nothing to approximately 3 feet deep (+ or -).

Work to remove the ash using excavators and dozers was performed between October and November of 2009. On November 10, 2009, I asked Don Givens, Brian Jacobs, and Robert Snow to walk down the Rookery to verify that the island had been cleaned of ash to an acceptable level. Don recommended a little additional cleaning and back dragging be performed. This was done later that day and the next day. On November 12, 2009, the area was deemed to be sufficiently cleaned.

Subsequently, Julie Pfiffer inspected the area along with Leo Francendese. All of the individuals that assessed the cleanliness concurred that the Rookery had been adequately cleaned.
