

SUMMARY OF QUESTIONNAIRE RESULTS

Here is a summary of the 15 responses sent in by Council members as of April 20, 2000. Similarly worded responses have been grouped together. Whenever there were differences in wording, the actual wording of items grouped together has been shown. The cumulative points for each grouping are also shown. Not everybody used points, so the points do not reflect total weighting among respondents.
